to Adult Day Training (ADT) Providers.

FCC deeply values the work you do.

Adult Day Training (ADT) delivers significant benefits to our members and remains one of the most frequently requested and utilized services by our enrollees with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). We understand that providing ADT is challenging, and that changes in policy—particularly those affecting iBudget ADT rates, may impact providers differently. For some, these changes may be positive; for others, they may create uncertainty.

We want you to succeed.

The purpose of this message is to clarify FCC's payment policies for ADT services and to invite your input as we develop an alternative rate structure for the future.

For now:

Please continue billing FCC for ADT services using the same hourly rates you are currently using.

For the future:

FCC is working collaboratively with The Arc of Florida and Florida ARF to design a new rate structure that is administratively simple to support a wide range of provider circumstances. We will be hosting a Provider Forum in January to discuss ADT rates and options for structuring these payments. Please watch for the announcement with the date and time—we encourage your participation.

FCC is committed to maintaining strong, positive partnerships with our providers. We want to hear from you. Your insight is essential as we work to develop a fair and sustainable ADT payment system.
